



COVID-19 Response Plan 2022-23

Updated January 2023

Our Focus: As we plan for the coming school year, we are focused on partnering with parents, patrons and staff to ensure our students reach high levels of student achievement and gain the knowledge, skills and attributes they need to be successful beyond high school.

In addition, we will continue our work to mitigate health and safety risks, including COVID-19. This plan outlines the actions we will take to try and limit the spread of COVID-19 and other illnesses in D91's schools and classrooms. Districtwide Actions:

- Encourage all eligible teachers and staff to be vaccinated and boosted in accordance with CDC guidance
- Encourage parents, patrons and eligible students to be vaccinated and boosted in accordance with CDC guidelines
- Clean and disinfect buses and other high traffic spaces
- Encourage students, staff, parents and patrons to follow health guidelines designed to limit the spread of COVID-19 and other illnesses. That guidance includes: following good hygiene practices such as frequently washing hands, coughing and sneezing into an elbow, cleaning and disinfecting high touch areas, monitoring your health, staying home when you're sick, etc.

Schoolwide Actions:

- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces in schools, common areas and classrooms
- Encourage good hygiene practices such as regular hand washing throughout the day
- Make hand sanitizer available in schools, common areas and classrooms

Parents, Patrons, Students & Staff Actions:

- Encourage parents, patrons, students and staff to do their part to help keep our schools open and operating without disruption to instruction including:
 - Follow health guidance and good hygiene practices
 - Stay home if you are sick or experiencing symptoms related to COVID-19 or other illnesses, and seek testing, help and guidance from a medical professional.
